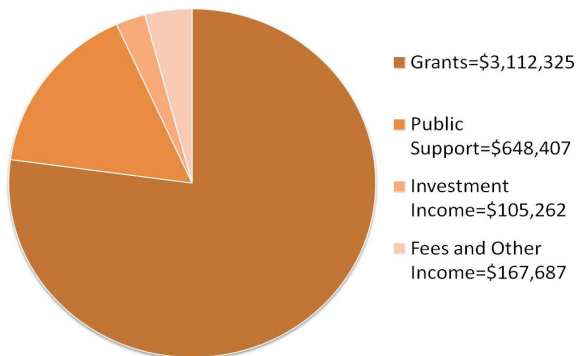

### **Examples of our 2011 successes:**

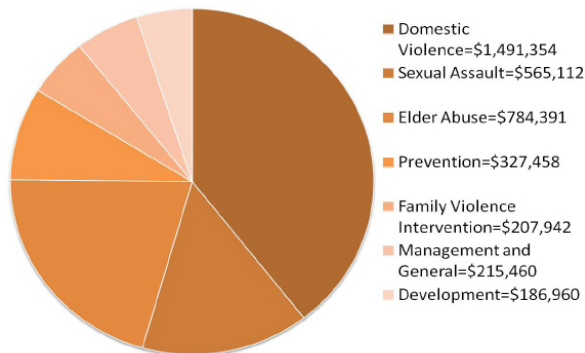
- 5,327 shelter nights for families so they can be safe
- 2,038 Orders of Protection to keep abusers away from their victims
- 3,046 home visits to seniors who were abused, neglected or financially exploited
- 844 staff and volunteer visits to nursing homes to check on well-being of residents
- 486 children and adults healing from their trauma of sexual abuse
- 657 students improving their grades and school attendance as a result of participation in “Mind Over Muscle” for middle - high school boys and “Helping All Relationships To be Safe” (HARTS) for middle - high school girls
- 1,374 3rd - 6th grade students were involved in anti-bullying Steps to Respect Programs in their schools in Peoria, Tazewell and Woodford counties
- 9,526 students in grades pre-k through 6th learned body safety rules through Keeping My Body Safe programs

We partner with school districts, the courts, probation offices, city and county officials and other community organizations to maximize our outcomes to keep people safe.
