Fiscal Year 2017 Annual Report

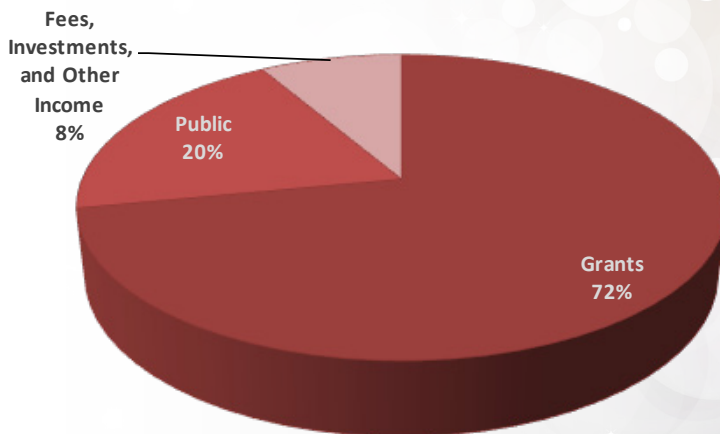
In FY 2017, The Center provided the following services:

- **4,391** safe nights in shelter for individuals and families fleeing abuse
- **2,117** Orders of Protection to keep abusers away from their victims
- **14,064** hours of service to **2,522** seniors and adults with disabilities who were abused, neglected, or financially exploited
- **1,135** staff and volunteer visits to nursing homes to check on the well-being of residents
- **432** children and adults healing from the trauma of sexual abuse through therapy services
- **175** men and women attended the 26 week Family Violence Intervention Program to learn about violence-free relationships
- Continuation of the “A Million Ways to Prevent Abuse” campaign has helped provide **4,850** teaching sessions in local schools, resulting in **67,071** contacts with students and teachers. Programs focused on body safety, bullying prevention, and healthy relationship skills.

The Center partners with school districts, the courts, probation offices, city and county officials, and other organizations to maximize our outcomes and to build a safe and peaceful community.

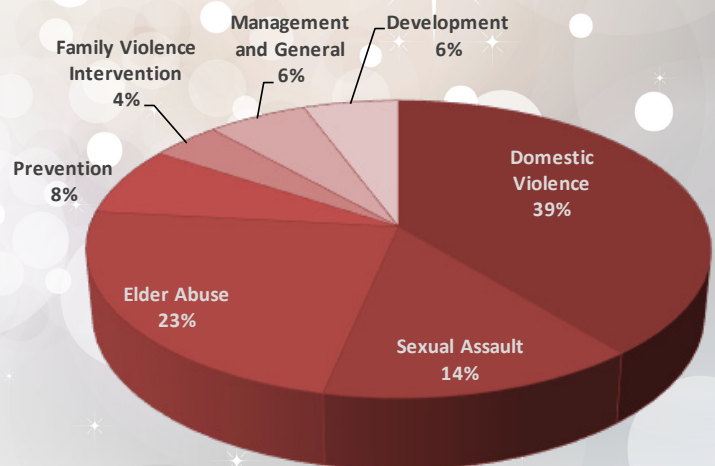
