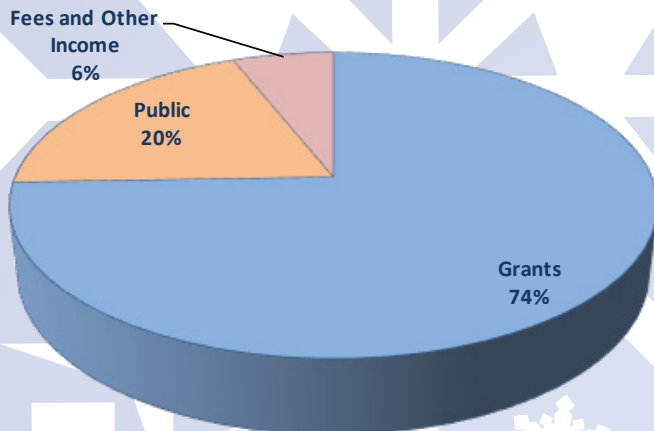
In FY 2016, The Center provided the following services:

- 5,466 shelter nights for families so they can be safe
- 2,097 Orders of Protection to keep abusers away from their victims
- 24,216 hours of service to 830 seniors and adults with disabilities who were abused, neglected or financially exploited
- 1,396 staff and volunteer visits to nursing homes to check on the well-being of residents
- 414 children and adults healing from the trauma of sexual abuse through therapy services
- 183 men and women attended the 26 week Family Violence Intervention Program to learn about violence free relationships
- Continuation of the “A Million Ways to Prevent Abuse” campaign has helped provide 4,850 teaching sessions in local schools, resulting in 86,602 contacts with students and teachers. Programs focused on body safety, bullying prevention and healthy relationship skills

The Center partners with school districts, the courts, probation offices, city and county officials and other community organizations to maximize our outcomes to keep people safe.

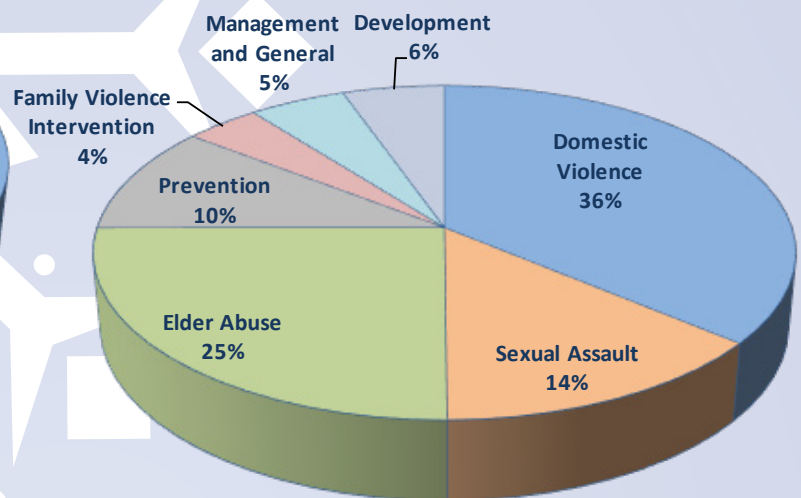
