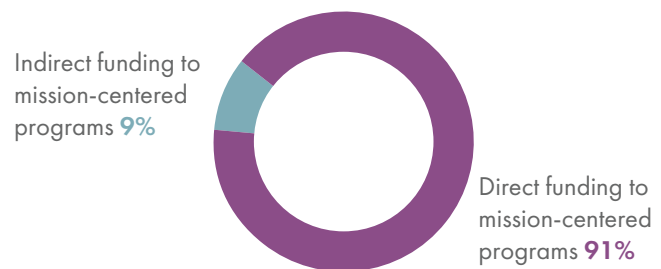


In FY 2021, CFPA provided the following services:

- **7,164 safe nights in shelter** for individuals and families fleeing violence or abuse
- **1,584 Orders of Protection** to keep abusers away from their victims
- **18,798 hours** of services to **810 seniors and adults living with disabilities** who were abused, neglected, or financially exploited
- **419 staff and volunteer visits** to long-term care facilities to check on the wellbeing of residents
- **683 children and adults** healing from trauma of interpersonal violence through therapy services
- **210 men and women** attended the 26-week Family Violence Intervention Project to learn about violence-free relationships
- **31,021 students** in Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford Counties received **2,950 classroom presentations** on child sexual abuse prevention, bullying prevention, healthy relationships, teen dating violence prevention, human trafficking prevention, and more
- **33 victims** of labor and sex trafficking received comprehensive care and services
- **45 trainings** provided to law enforcement, first responders, medical providers, utility workers, and more about human trafficking indicators
- **323 medical advocacies** in local emergency departments for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault

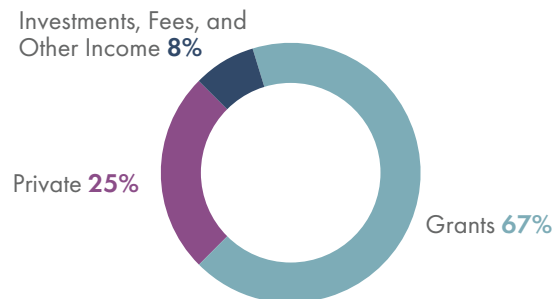
CFPA partners with school districts, the courts, probation officers, city and county officials, and other organizations to maximize our outcomes and to build a safe and peaceful community.

For every dollar received, Center for Prevention of Abuse applies 91% of that donation directly to the funding of our mission-centered programs, while the remaining 9% is used to fund activities that provide indirect support to those programs.



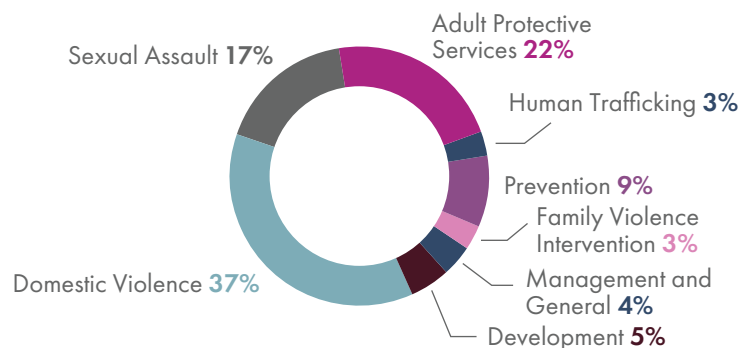
