

In FY 2018, CFPA provided the following services:

- **8,450 safe nights in shelter** for individuals and families fleeing violence or abuse
- **1,947 Orders of Protection** to keep abusers away from their victims
- **20,120 hours** of services to **797 seniors and adults with disabilities** who were abused, neglected, or financially exploited
- **1,239 staff and volunteer visits** to nursing homes to check on the well-being of residents
- **491 children and adults** healing from the trauma of sexual abuse through therapy services
- **196 men and women** attended the 26 week Family Violence Intervention Project to learn about violence-free relationships
- **34,560 students** in Peoria, Tazewell, and Woodford Counties received **4,114 classroom presentations** on child sexual abuse prevention, bullying prevention, healthy relationships, teen dating violence prevention and more
- CPFA created a new department, **Human Trafficking Services**, to provide free and confidential services for survivors of labor and sex trafficking, both foreign-born and domestic
- **17 victims** of labor and sex trafficking received comprehensive care and services
- **48 hours** of training provided to law enforcement, first responders, medical providers, and more about human trafficking indicators
- **264 medical advocacies** in local emergency departments for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault

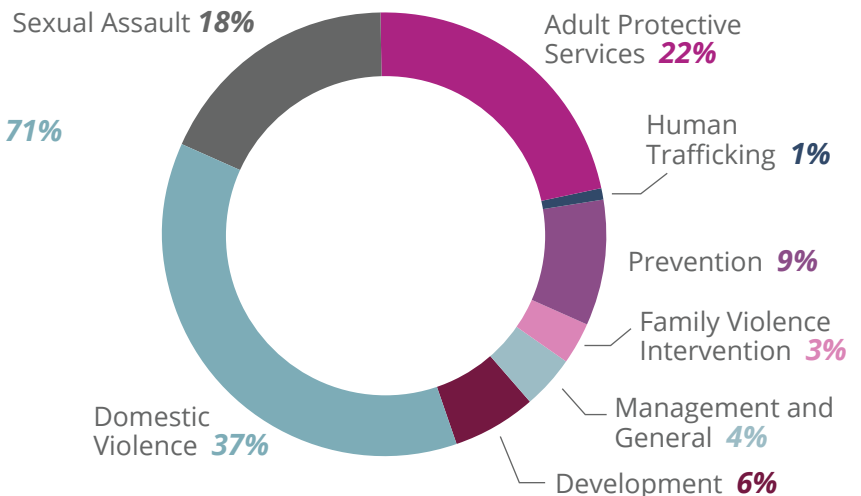
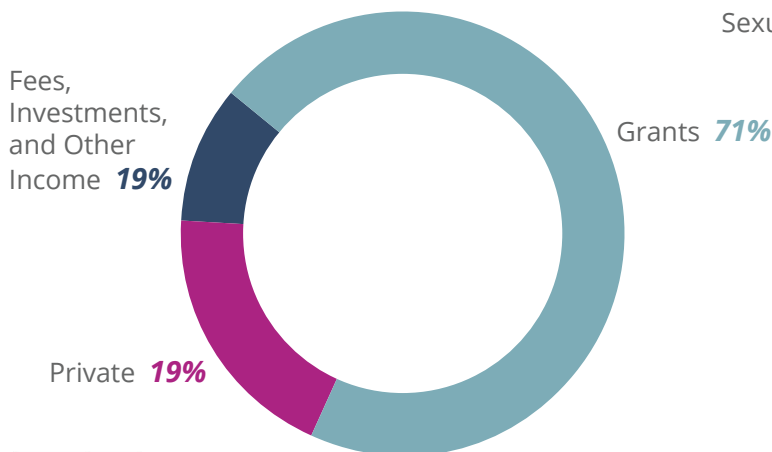
CFPA partners with school districts, the courts, probation officers, city and county officials, and other organizations to maximize our outcomes and to build a safe and peaceful community.
